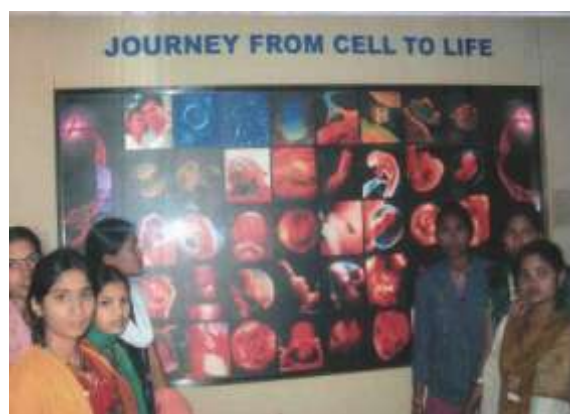


December 2011
